The study offered creative and workable answers, such as better drainage systems, construction of elevated pathway, and installation of rainwater catchment system. After it was fully implemented, the school saw a notable decrease in floodwater buildup, making the grounds safer and easier for personnel and students to access. This noticeable enhancement made it possible for students to move around freely and comfortably, demonstrating the school's commitment to both safety and high-quality instruction.

This achievement is a proud result of Project LIGTAS-Saliksik, a program led by Mr. James Angelo T. Año, SDO Batangas' Project Development Officer II, which provided support and research skills to 25 Project Development Officer I. The study's success shows how capacity-building initiatives result in significant improvements in educational institutions.
